1 Tokyo

Upon arrival of Tokyo Narita International Airport, please proceed to the hotel via airport shuttle. (Shuttle bus to Hilton Narita locates at Terminal 2 platform 26, or Terminal 1 platform 16. The latest shuttle leave airport at 10:30pm. If you miss the last shuttle please proceed to hotel via taxi on your own expenses. (Passengers check-in hotel with passport.) Meals are not included.

2 Tokyo

After breakfast, we first head to the Imperial Palace of Tokyo – the residence of the royal family – and visit the “double bridge” (Nijubashi) over the moat. The bridge is a symbol of the Palace. Afterwards we go to the Tokyo Skytree. With a height of 634 metres, it is a broadcasting, restaurant, and observation tower in Sumida. And then we proceed to Senso-ji, an ancient Buddhist temple. It is Tokyo's oldest temple, and one of its most significant. The Nakamise-dori is a street on the approach to the temple, which housing many traditional shops for souvenirs. Meiji Shrine was built in dedication to Emperor Meiji and Empress Shoken. The original shrine was destroyed during World War II; the current one was re-built in 1958. This area is covered by an evergreen forest that consists of 120,000 trees of 365 different species, which were donated by people from all parts of Japan when the shrine was established.

3 Tokyo — Shizuoka

After breakfast we head to Fuji Mountain 5th Station (Depend on weather), a perfect spot to view the stunning Fuji Mountain. And then we visit **Oshino Hakkai (Additional Tours)**, a touristy set of eight ponds in Oshino on the site of a former sixth lake that dried out several hundred years ago. The eight ponds are fed by snow melt from the slopes of nearby Mount Fuji that filters down the mountain through porous layers of lava for over 80 years, resulting in very clear spring water that is revered by the locals. Visit Lake Kawaguchi before going to Nagasaki Peace Park – established in 1955, commemorating the atomic bombing of the city on August 9, 1945 during World War II. At the park's north end is the 10-meter-tall Peace Statue created by sculptor Seibo Kitamura of Nagasaki Prefecture. The statue's right hand points to the threat of nuclear weapons while the extended left hand symbolizes eternal peace. The mild face symbolizes divine grace and the gently closed eyes offer a prayer for the repose of the bomb victims' souls. Tonight we either enjoy the famous Kaiseki, a traditional multi-course Japanese dinner, or King crab buffet. Enjoy all facilities in the hotel and all kinds of hot spring spa. (B/L/D)

4 Shizuoka — Magome-juku — Kyoto

After breakfast we head to **Atsuta Shrine (Additional Tours)**. The shrine's Bunkaden, or treasure hall, houses over 4,000 relics, which include 174 Important Cultural Properties and a dagger that is a designated National Treasure of Japan. Proceed to **Magome-juku (Additional Tours)** after visiting a Jewelry workshop. Magome-juku was the 43rd of the 69 stations of the Nakasendō, an ancient road that connected Kyoto and Edo during the Edo period. It was also the last of eleven stations along the Kisoji, which was the precursor to a part of the Nakasendō, running through the Kiso Valley.

This well-preserved section of the old route gives you a magnificent atmosphere of ancient Japan. Enakyo Valley is a beautiful scenic area whose man-made lake was originally formed because of the construction of a dam downriver. It is a river valley where, in the spring, cherry blossoms bloom in full force and, in the fall, the cliffs blaze red and yellow with autumn leaves. Enjoy dinner at your own accord this evening. 5 Kyoto — Nara — Osaka

After breakfast we shall go to the UNESCO World Heritage Site – **Kiyomizu-dera (Additional Tours)**. The temple was founded in 778, and its present buildings were constructed in 1633, ordered by the Tokugawa Iemitsu. There is not a single nail used in the entire structure. Enjoy the world's famous 5A Kobe beef for lunch before going to **Tōdai-ji (Additional Tours)** in Nara. Tōdai-ji is currently the world's largest wood structure. Afterward we shall spend some times for shopping at the duty free and Shinsaibashi, and enjoy all kind of delicious cuisines in the nearby Dotonbori at your own accord. (B/L)
